∞ **Making your "Easter Duty"**

As a minimum obligation, Catholics are required to receive Holy Communion at least once during the year during the Easter season. Also, because Catholics are to be in a "state of grace" when receiving Holy Communion, they are to make a good confession of sins in the Sacrament of Penance, if conscious of any mortal or serious sins. In the United States, the Easter duty may be accomplished during the time between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost).

∞ **Lenten Penance Service Tuesday, March 27 (mark your calendars!!!)**

The annual Lenten Penance Service will be held on Tuesday, March 27 at 7:00 p.m. in the Cathedral. (We realize that there was an error in the mailing that went to all our registered parishioners.) The correct date is Tuesday, March 27.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On this Sunday before the start of the holy season of Lent, all of us need to begin focusing on the call to conversion, that is, a life in which we move away from sin in order to turn towards God. The prophet Zechariah's words are a good reminder as Lent begins:

***Return to me, says the Lord of hosts, and
I will return to you.***

The schedule of Ash Wednesday liturgies is printed below. There is ample opportunity for you to come and receive ashes as a sign of willingness to cooperate with God's grace in changing our lives.

Finally, allow me to remind you that *each Friday* there will be additional opportunities for you to deepen the spiritual journey in Lent. In addition to the usual 7:00 a.m. Mass, we will also have a 12:00 noon Mass in the Cathedral. Stations of the Cross will take place at 1:30 and 7:00 p.m. in the Cathedral. And, at the Prince of Peace Votive Church, there will be Evening Prayer with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 4:30 p.m.

☞ Lenten Fast & Abstinence Regulations



ENTER INTO THE
“SEASON” OF LENT

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one’s needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. If for a serious reason the laws of fast and abstinence cannot be followed, a suitable act of charity or mercy may be substituted.
6. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
