In addition to the 7:00 a.m. Mass, we also encourage you to celebrate Vespers (Evening Prayer) at 7:00 p.m. Candles will be blessed at the evening liturgy and you are invited to bring any candles that you use in your home for devotional/religious practices.

Friday, February 3 is the Memorial of Saint Blaise.

It is the traditional day for the blessing of throats which will be given following the 7:00 a.m. Mass in the Cathedral and the 8:30 a.m. Mass at the Prince of Peace Votive Church (prior to Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament). In addition, the blessing will be given at 7:00 p.m. in the Cathedral during a celebration of the Liturgy of the Word.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Pope Benedict XVI made some very strong statements on January 19 to a group of U.S. bishops from Michigan, Ohio and the mid-Atlantic states. Here, in part, are some of our Holy Father's words:

... [I]t is imperative that the entire Catholic community in the United States come to realize the grave threats to the Church's public moral witness presented by a radical secularism which finds increasing expression in the political and cultural spheres. The seriousness of these threats needs to be clearly appreciated at every level of ecclesial life. Of particular concern are certain attempts being made to limit that most cherished of American freedoms, the freedom of religion. Many of you have pointed out that concerted efforts have been made to deny the right of conscientious objection on the part of Catholic individuals and institutions with regard to cooperation in intrinsically evil practices. Others have spoken to me of a worrying tendency to reduce religious freedom to mere freedom of worship without guarantees of respect for freedom of conscience.

His Holiness goes on to speak of "the need for an engaged, articulate and well-formed Catholic laity." Our parish is certainly giving you that opportunity beginning February 1 with Fr. Robert Barron's DVD series *Catholicism*. I hope that all of you make every effort to attend, so that you know and continue to learn about our Catholic faith so you can **live** it and **defend** it. The series begins this Wednesday evening at 7:00 p.m.

✠ New Memorial Plaques and Markers in Cathedral

You will notice that four new bronze plaques have been placed in the Cathedral. Two acknowledge the donations for the restoration of the Cathedral's famous stained-glass windows in 2004 and of the Stations of the Cross in 2009. A plaque has also been placed to the right of the stairs entering the main sanctuary in remembrance of Fr. Pedro Camps, Fr. Narciso Font and Don Miguel Lorenzo de Ysnardy (contractor for the building of the original church on this site) who are buried here. Finally, a plaque has been placed next to the papal decree which designated the Cathedral as a minor basilica in 1976.
