## URGENT! Urge Co-sponsorship of Respect for Rights of Conscience Act

As you now know, on January 20, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) reaffirmed the rule first issued last August that virtually all private health care plans must cover sterilization, abortifacients, and contraception. Non-profit religious employers that do not now provide such coverage, and are not exempt under the rule's extremely narrow definition of religious employer, are given one year to comply.

All Catholics are strongly urged to do their part in ensuring that the HHS mandate is overturned. **A first step is to continue to urge Members of Congress to co-sponsor the Respect for Rights of Conscience Act** (H.R. 1179, S. 1467). This measure will ensure that those who participate in the health care system "retain the right to provide, purchase, or enroll in health coverage that is consistent with their religious beliefs and moral convictions."

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

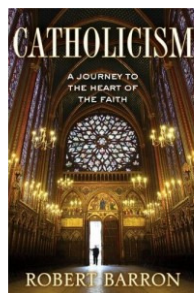
Maybe you have heard this already, but if not I want you to save these two dates in your calendars now – Friday, March 9 and Saturday, March 10. Our bishop, Felipe Estévez, has called a Eucharistic Congress for the Diocese of St. Augustine. It will take place at St. Joseph Parish in Jacksonville and its theme is "Become What You Receive."

This Eucharistic Congress is an opportunity for our local Church to be renewed by Christ in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood. Bishop Estévez wants to hold an annual Congress for the Diocese so that the Eucharist can truly be the "Sacrament of Faith, the Sign of Unity and the Seal of Charity," as our patron St. Augustine of Hippo so eloquently stated in the 5<sup>th</sup> century. In Latin, Augustine's words were *O sacramentum pietatis, O signum unitatis, O vinculum caritatis*. On Saturday, March 10, the speakers include two of the Cathedral's former pastors, Bishop Robert Baker ("The Fruits of Holy Communion") and Fr. Terry Morgan ("Eucharist in the Gospels of the New Testament"). There will be tracks in English and Spanish as well as a special track for children. On Friday, March 9 at 7:00 p.m. a sacred concert of music and reflections on the Eucharist will be given. ## ARE YOU 18 YEARS OLD, OR OLDER? REGISTER AT YOUR LOCAL PARISH!

No one may ever have told you this before, but if you are 18 years old, or older, you should register at your local parish. This is true even if you still live at your parents' home (in fact, once you turn 18, you are no longer included under your parents' registration) or if you are going to college. **The parish you register in should be the one where you live the majority of the year.**

We realize that registering at a parish is not at the top of your mind once you turn 18, or even into your early 20's. However, we strongly encourage you to do so. It could greatly help should you wish to get married in your local parish, or wish to be a Godparent or Confirmation sponsor, have a child baptized, or send your children to the parish schools.

It should be noted that having attended CPS, having received First Communion or Confirmation at the Cathedral, or having entered the Church via RCIA does NOT automatically register you in the Cathedral Parish. We never automatically register anyone. The process must be initiated by you.
